

QUESTION: If the excellence of races is to be appreciated by the purity of their blood and the inviolability of their national character, who can vie in nobility with the still surviving remains of the Celtic race?

Which of the following would serve as a conclusion to the passage?

OPTIONS:

- a) The Saxons and Vikings have only grown with time to inculcate the habits of the entire human family.
- b) Some races have been subject to intermingling and conquest that has confused racial bloodlines beyond redemption
- c) There are races that have bled out on the entire battlefield, but none but the Vikings and Celts can claim to have remained chastely exclusive.
- d) Never has a human family lived more apart from the world and been purer from all alien admixtures.

SOLUTION: Since the passage ends on a question mark, the concluding line must answer decisively. Hence D
